This kind is supposed to be catalogued under several assumed names, but is really the one variety. It is excellent for all purposes and makes handsome bunches for market. It may be carried to the house for preparing as soon as it is pulled, it having thick stout stalks and is not so liable to break as the Linnaus and Victoria. If my readers wish to force
